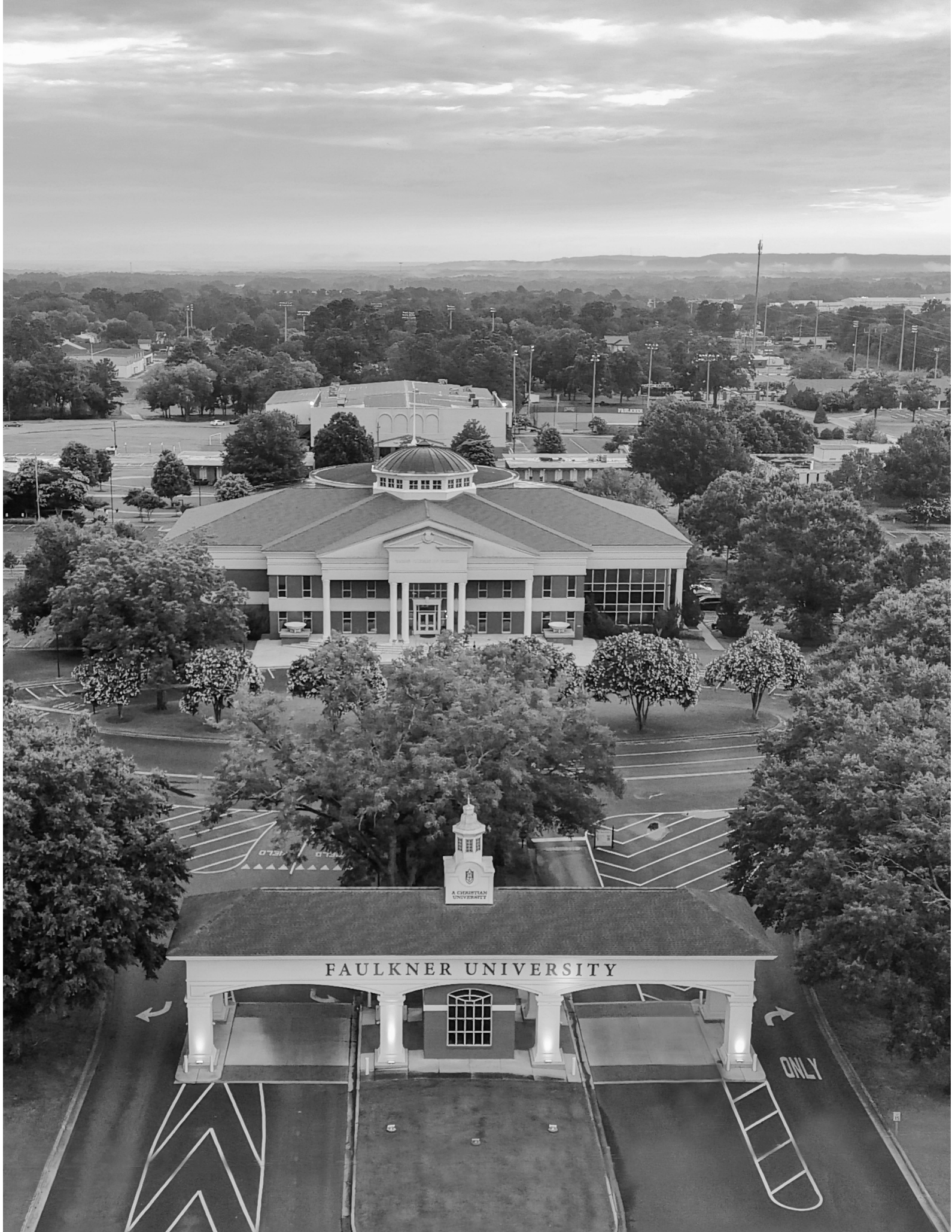

Justice Will Parker



Justice William G. Parker, Jr. (“Will”), was appointed to the Alabama Supreme Court on November 10, 2025, by Governor Kay Ivey. His appointment continues a career of public service dedicated to upholding the Constitution and preserving the rule of law.

Before joining the Court, Justice Parker served as an attorney in the Office of the Governor, including for nearly six years as General Counsel to the Governor. In this capacity, Justice Parker advised Governor Ivey and her administration on a wide range of issues—from education, economic development, ethics, and elections to procurement, government accountability, regulation, and public safety. By virtue of his position, Justice Parker served on the Alabama Judicial Resources Allocation Commission and the Court Advisory Committee for the U.S. District Court for the Middle District of Alabama.

Prior to joining Governor Ivey’s office, Justice Parker worked for nearly ten years as Assistant Attorney General in the Constitutional Defense Division of the Alabama Attorney General’s Office. There, Justice Parker handled cases in state and federal trial and appellate courts defending state policies in areas including court administration, campaign finance, economic policy, education, environmental law, immigration, public employment, public finance, and taxation.

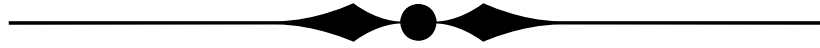
Justice Parker came to the AG’s Office after clerking for the Honorable Ed Carnes of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit. Earlier in his career, he taught U.S. History at a Montgomery public high school.

Justice Parker graduated magna cum laude from the University of Alabama School of Law, where he was Senior Articles Editor for the Alabama Law Review and a member of the National Moot Court Team. He earned his undergraduate degree in political science with a concentration in education from Davidson College, where he was Chair of the College Honor Council and President of the College Union Board.

Justice Parker and his wife Karen are the proud parents of two school-aged sons. A seventh-generation Alabamian, Justice Parker is a Trustee for the Eleventh Circuit Historical Society, a member of the Federalist Society, and a member of First Methodist Church. Growing up, Justice Parker was active in Scouting, earning his Eagle, working at Camp Tukabatchee and Philmont Scout Ranch, and serving in 1999 as National Chief of the Order of the Arrow.

Aigner Kolom, is a principal attorney at Beasley Allen Law Firm, where she focuses on complex mass tort and product liability litigation in both state courts and federal multidistrict litigation. Throughout her career, she has played a key role in high stakes cases involving defective pharmaceutical drugs and medical devices and has contributed to teams that have secured multiple multi million dollar settlements on behalf of individuals and families nationwide. Her work has included major litigations such as Xarelto and metal on metal hip implant cases, and she is currently focused on the national Hair Relaxer litigation.

Aigner earned her undergraduate degree in Business Administration from Auburn University and went on to receive her law degree from Faulkner University's Thomas Goode Jones School of Law, where she graduated summa cum laude. She is admitted to practice law in Alabama, Georgia, and Illinois.

Beyond her legal practice, Aigner has built a distinguished record of leadership and service within the profession. She currently serves as President of the Montgomery County Bar Association, making history as the first African American woman to lead the organization in its 111 year history. Her leadership is the culmination of years of service, including previously serving as President of the Alabama Lawyers Association and President of the Montgomery County Bar Association Women's Section. She currently serves as Vice President of the Black Women Lawyers Association of Alabama and as Deputy Regional Director for Region 11 of the National Bar Association. She remains actively involved in organizations including, the American Association for Justice, and the Federal Bar Association.

Her commitment to service extends beyond the legal profession. Aigner serves on the Board of Directors for Hope Inspired Ministries and The Grove, where she supports efforts focused on empowerment, restoration, and creating meaningful opportunities within the community.

Aigner has been recognized on the Mid South Super Lawyers Rising Stars list since 2020. In 2024, she was also recognized as an Attorney on the Rise as part of the Southeastern Legal Awards presented by ALM and Law.com. Additionally, she has been named to The National Black Lawyers Top 40 Under 40 list and, most recently, was included in the 2026 edition of Best Lawyers Ones to Watch in America for her work in mass tort litigation.

Aigner is also currently pursuing her Master's degree in Artificial Intelligence, reflecting her commitment to innovation and the future of professional practice.

Outside of her legal career, Aigner has a passion for traveling and exploring different cultures and legal systems around the world. Her goal is to visit 50 countries by the time she turns 40.

Above all, she is a devoted mother to two children, and is deeply committed to mentorship, service, and inspiring the next generation to lead with excellence, purpose, and impact.

CORDS:

Black and gold cords denote membership in *Chi Alpha Sigma*, a National College Athlete honor society.

Red and white cords denote membership in *Phi Alpha Theta*, a National History Honor Society.

Blue and white cords identify Graduate Counseling students with a 3.7 GPA or higher.

Gold cord identifies those graduating with honors. In the traditional program, honors are announced in increasing levels of honor as *cum laude*, *magna cum laude*, and *summa cum laude*.

Green and purple cords denote membership in *Kappa Delta Pi*, an international Education honor society.

Orange and white cords denote membership in the National Student Speech-Language-Hearing Association.

Platinum and dark blue cords denote membership in *Psi Chi*, an international Psychology honor society.

Black and platinum cords denote membership in the National Society of Leadership and Success.

Red cord denotes membership in the Aspiring Educators Program.

Red, white, and blue cords denote military service.

LAPEL PIN:

Black and gold pin with Faulkner emblem denotes recipient of the Lou Harris Criminal Justice Honor Graduate Award.

MEDALLIONS:

Blue and gold medallion on blue ribbon denotes membership in *Alpha Iota Sigma*, an Interdisciplinary Studies honor society.

Blue and gold medallion on gold ribbon denotes membership in *Sigma Zeta*, a national honor society for Mathematics, Computer Science, and Science majors.

Gold medallion on blue and green ribbon denotes membership in *Alpha Chi*, a national honor society.

Red and black medallion on red and black ribbon denotes membership in the National Society of Leadership and Success.

Silver medallion on blue ribbon identifies honorees of Faulkner's academic departments.

STOLES:

Red stole with the Sigma Tau Delta emblem embroidered in black denotes membership in the English Honor Society.

Blue stole with white trim denotes successful graduation in Faulkner's Great Books Honors program.

Purple stole with white trim denotes membership in *Lambda Epsilon Chi*, a national Paralegal honor society.

Silver stole with Greek letters ΚΑΠΙ in black denotes membership in *Kappa Delta Pi*, an international Education honor society.

Platinum stole with Greek letters ΣΑΠΙ denotes membership in The National Society of Leadership and Success.
